Students in Years 3 and 5 at Ainslie and around Australia will be participating in the *National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy* this week. The assessment tasks provide a snapshot of student performance that is used by the school and the directorate in analysing performance trends, programs and resourcing across the school and system. Families receive individual reports about their children's performance on the test later in the year.

NAPLAN tasks will be conducted this Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday morning and we thank families, in anticipation, for helping our students arrive at school well rested, with energy from a nourishing breakfast, and on time to support their smooth participation.

Gymnastics Clinics for K-3

Launchpad is the name for Gymnastics Australia's junior recreational gymnastics programs. On Thursday this week, students from Kindergarten to Year 3 will commence a four week program run by Canberra City Gymnastics. The LaunchPad program is all about teaching children the fundamental movement skills they need to lead an active and healthy life full of sport and recreation. Designed to give children the opportunity to practice, develop and enjoy moving through a wide-range of activities, the LaunchPad program will help them to develop physically, socially and cognitively. LaunchPad relies on safe and enjoyable activities that challenge participants relative to their abilities and stage of development. Many of the games and activities in LaunchPad are based on what gymnastics coaches around the world have been delivering for years. Importantly, research tells us that children who have these fundamental skills are far more likely to participate in sport and recreation throughout life. Fundamental Movement Skill activities benefit children through providing a foundation for lifelong participation in sport and recreation; a foundation for future participation in gymnastics; and optimised activities for brain and body development. This program has been funded through the Australian Government's Sporting Schools' Program.

2019 ENROLMENT TIMELINE

Attention to all parents and carers of current Year 6 students and prospective Preschoolers for 2019.

Enrolment applications for term 1 of 2019 are now open as of 30 April 2018 and must be submitted online at <https://form.act.gov.au/smartforms/landing.htm?formCode1087>

All ACT children are guaranteed a place in an ACT Public School, from preschool through to college. Information about the enrolment assessment criteria and priority enrolment areas can be found at https://www.education.act.gov.au/school_education/enrolling_in_an_act_public_school.

If you are applying to enrol in preschool, year 7 or year 11 we ask that you submit your application by 4 June 2018 to support timely processing and school planning. From 30 June 2018, after the application has been processed, parent/carers will commence receiving advice from the school on the enrolment. Please note, that the order in which applications are received is not a factor in schools determining places and as a result there is no requirement to submit your application form on the first day applications open.

Housekeeping

Managing Student Attendance

Please remember to communicate with us when your child is absent. We ask parents to make contact with the school's office team by phone or email on the day of the absence.

The Education Directorate has introduced a new system of managing student attendance and you will soon start receiving SMS messages if your student has unexplained absences. Students who arrive late are asked to come to the front office to check in, where staff will change their attendance status on the system and give them a card to take to their teacher.
